Ladies and Gentlemen,

In an ever-changing world with increasingly complex issues, the urge to develop novel policy processes is more pressing than ever. In this context, behavioral insights have established, in a very short period of time, a strong track record in helping governments address environmental, social and economic multifaceted complexities and are now deeply rooted in public bodies all across the world.

Since 2016, the State of Qatar has been introducing behaviorally inspired processes, tools and practices in its policy development and has built a favorable environment conducive to the creation and growth of enterprises exploring the potential of behavioral insights in informing policy; in 2016, the Supreme Committee for Delivery and Legacy – the entity tasked with the delivery of the 2022 FIFA World Cup infrastructure and with the enrichment of the ensuing legacy–established the MENA region's first behavioral insights and nudge unit: the Qatar Behavioral Insights Unit (QBIU), now incorporated under the Qatar Financial Centre. Today, the Unit promotes evidence-based policies to address challenges with behavioral roots in sports and health, workers' welfare, sustainability and entrepreneurship, education, social cohesion and inclusion, and public service delivery.

To date, Qatar National Research Fund has provided over \$1.4 Billion to fund more than 2,300 research and innovation projects.
