AS DELIVERED

When the General Assembly established UNOCT in 2017, it inherited the UN Counter-Terrorism Center (UNCCT), which already had a team in the UN Regional Centre for Prevent ve Diplomacy in Central Asia in Ashgabat helping implement the regional Joint Plan of Act on.

Over the course of the following six years, UNOCT has established just five programme of ces and currently maintains only four field presences, including the one in Ashgabat.

But here's something I bet you won't hear from other UN ent tes: when UNOCT's work in a feld locat on is done or no longer suitable, we *close* them!

That's right: we have closed down f eld presences in Bishkek, Dhaka, Khartoum, Nouakchot, and Ouagadougou. Our presence in Manila, implement ng the CT Travel Programme, will close when the system becomes operat onal.

We have established a senior feld coordinator to make sure our feld presences and our programme of ces are ft-for-purpose, results-oriented, and appropriately resourced, as well as help inst tut onalize our relationships with Resident Coordinators and the Development Coordination Of ce.

In that regard, let me highlight three characterist cs of our Programme Of ces that define our operational model:
