I look forward to continuing working with you to support African and other Member States af ected by the scourge of terrorism.

In conclusion, the General Assembly's mandate, outlined in operat ve paragraph 96 of the eighth review resolut on of the UN Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy, presents a unique opportunity to assess the impact of our CT and PCVE ef orts. We appeal to Member States to allocate appropriate resources to conduct a full-f edged and independent evaluat on, yielding robust f ndings on results achieved, good pract ces, and lessons learned.

Addit onally, we urge Compact ent t es to act vely collaborate with the Resource Mobilizat on, Monitoring and Evaluat on Working Group of the Compact in the development of a unif ed results framework and the evaluat ve exercise. This collaborat ve endeavor is crucial for a meaningful measurement and assessment of our collect ve impact in countering terrorism and prevent ng violent extremism conducive to terrorism.
