

Migration and Development Link

Two-way connection



- š Migration is not a panacea for poverty and underdevelopment
- Š Not a substitute for development policy

Maximizing the positive effect & minimizing the negative:




Depends on the policies put in place



Governments Request to IOM:

- **5 From developing countries: how does** migration affect achievement of our national development goals?
- **S From development partners: how can we assist developing countries in maximizing the positive potential of migration and minimizing negative effects?**

How Does Migration Affect Achievement of National Development Goals?

1st Step: Assess National Migration Dynamics – Migration Profile



- **š** Inflows/outflows of migrants
 - **š** Forced and/or voluntary
 - š High and/or lower skilled
 - **š** Gender composition
 - **š** Duration of flows
- **Š** Sectors affected, i.e. care workers
 - š Remittances, networks

Whole of Society Approach

- **š** Engage non-governmental stakeholders
- š i.e. academic and expert community, service providers, local government officials, private sector, NGO, etc.





Evidence-based Policy Making

- **š** With picture of national migration dynamics
- Š Plus organized intra-governmental and national level consultative process
- Ø Evidence-based and coherent policy making integrating migration in national development strategies and planning
 - Øi.e. PRSPs, national development plans





Coherent International Support

- Š Nationally-driven integration of migration in development planning instruments then allows for:
- Š Coherent international support



Next Steps

š Pilot testing

- Ø Identification of 4 − 5 countries interested in mainstreaming migration in their national development planning tools and instruments
- ØGMG work in a coordinated manner to offer expert support to national government efforts
- Ø Draw lessons learned; adjust and update handbook and related tools, as necessary

- Š Until now much discussion and debate on relationship between migration and development
- Š Now, practical tool to fully integrate migration in national development planning
- Š Outcome will necessarily differ by country and its goals
- š Make relationship concrete
