Further, Singapore has, since 2016, ratified the International Convention on the Suppression of Acts of Nuclear Terrorism on 2 August 2017. Singapore has legislation in place to give effect to this Convention.

Singapore has also had the Terrorism (Suppression of Financing) Act (TSOFA) in place since 2002, to give effect to the International Convention for the Suppression of the Financing of Terrorism. Since 2016, Singapore has added 21 individuals to the First Schedule of the TSOFA which contains a list of

individuals designated as terrorists. Singapore also successfully prosecuted six individuals for terrorism-financing offences under the TSOFA in May 2016. Investigations revealed that these individuals had formed a pro-ISIS group in Singapore called the Islamic State in Bangladesh (“ISB”). The ISB aimed to overthrow the Bangladeshi government through the use of force, establish an Islamic state in Bangladesh and bring it under ISIS’ self-declared caliphate. All six accused persons pleaded guilty and were convicted. Their sentences ranged
