Micronesia and other States in the Pacific have relevant and consistent State practice on this point, as grounded in our views of the relevant international law, including at regional and subregional levels. Micronesia will work with the rest of the Pacific to contribute to the work of the Commission on this topic, including through regional and national comments in response to the Commission's call for information.

In that connection, just last week, Micronesia deposited charts and lists of geographical coordinates of points for all our maritime zones and baselines as well as all our maritime delimitation treaties with the United Nations Secretary-General, in line with our obligations under UNCLOS as well as the United Nations Charter. As part of that deposit, Micronesia has attached a set of observations which reference, among other things, our understanding that we are not obliged to keep under review the maritime zones reflected in such an official deposit, as delineated in accordance with UNCLOS, as well as our intent to maintain these maritime zones in line with that understanding, notwithstanding climate change-induced sea-
