

As a Global Theme Champion for the Energy Transition, the Federal Government of Brazil is putting forth two Energy Compacts, establishing voluntary commitments under the framework of the United Nations High-Level Dialogue on Energy, to accelerate the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goal 7 - SDG7.

The [redacted] intends to foster the development of a hydrogen industry and market in Brazil. Hydrogen will be fundamental for advancing the energy transition on the so-called hard to abate sectors. This Energy Compact addresses the need for strengthening Research, Development and Innovation policies; promoting capacity building and professional training; and establishing a platform to collect and organize data, to disseminate information and to facilitate the monitoring of all initiatives, programs and market developments, as well as their effectiveness and results.
